When in the Course of human events, it becomes assessment for one people to descrive the political touris which have connected them with another and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all even are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator. with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are lafe, afterny and the pursuit of Happines .- That to secure these aghis, Governments are instituted among Men. deriving their **just** powers from the consent of the governed. —That whenever any horm of Government becomes destructive of these ends in is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing in powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness. Prudence, indeed, will dictate that Governments long established should not be changed for light and transient causes; and accordingly all experience andh shewn, that mankind are more disposed to suffer, while evil are sufferable, than to right themselves by abolishing the forms to which they are accustomed.
